Having more than 6.5 million people, Toronto is the third largest city in North America. Immigrants from all over the world have settled in the Greater Toronto Area (GTA), making it one of the world's most diverse places to live and work.

According to the 2011 census published in 2012, Spanish is one of the top five languages spoken in the GTA. Approximately 500,000 Latin Americans from over 20 countries live in the GTA.
